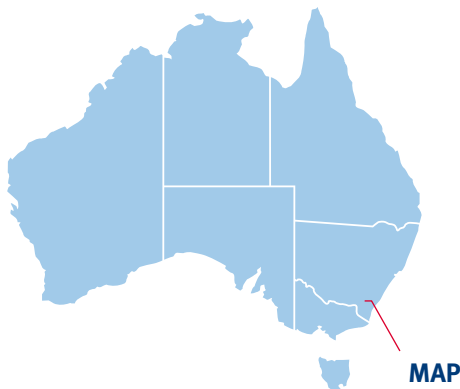




APPROXIMATE DISTANCE TO DEFENCE LOCATIONS

Defence Housing
AUSTRALIA

Canberra is located in the Australian Capital Territory, which is surrounded by New South Wales. The city is 150km inland, 280km from Sydney and 660km from Melbourne. Canberra's population is approximately 325,000. Apart from Civic (the City Centre), Canberra is divided into four main 'town centres' - Woden, Tuggeranong, Gungahlin and Belconnen. Buses travel to and from all parts of the city and major shopping centres.

Finding a property

All of Canberra, Queanbeyan and Jerrabomberra are suitable locations for housing. Many members find it difficult to secure housing due to the availability of properties, competitiveness of the market, lack of rental properties accepting pets, and the requirement to inspect the property before a tenancy application is accepted.

Two real estate websites you may find useful are www.allhomes.com.au and www.realestate.com.au.

Real estate agents commonly advertise properties only a few weeks before vacancy, with many only advertising after the property becomes vacant. Inspections of the properties are often 'open house' and are generally held in the afternoons during the week.

The inner southern and northern suburbs are more expensive than the outer lying areas. These include Kingston, Manuka, Griffith, City, Yarralumla, Bruce, Braddon, Turner, and Dickson. Many of these properties contain limited off street parking with a lack of lock-up facilities. Many fully-furnished apartments are located within the Woden and City area, convenient to transport and shopping.

NOTE - Ceiling increases to cover any rent above the ceiling entitlement is not guaranteed, and must meet the requirements as set out in the Defence Pay and Conditions Manual (**PACMAN**). You should check your eligibility before submitting a request.

Townhouses and units

Townhouses and units are subject to Body Corporate rules. Please ask your landlord or real estate agent for details. The ability to keep pets in townhouses is limited and you should check with the landlord or real estate agent in regards to this. Dogs must also be registered. If you have a pet you may find it easier to find a rental property in the outer suburbs.

House hunting trips

House hunting trips are subject to approval. If you wish to apply for a house hunting trip please refer to **PACMAN** for your entitlements or alternatively, contact DHA on **139 DHA (139 342)**.



Utilities

You will need to arrange your own utilities such as electricity, gas, pay TV, internet services or telephone. You should contact your local service providers, or you may like to take advantage of the free **Fast Connect** service, where they will arrange for the disconnection and reconnection of utilities on your behalf – you can contact them on **1300 661 464** (local call cost) or access the service via the **DHA** website.

Public transport

Action Buses run throughout Canberra, while **Deanes Buslines** cover the Queanbeyan and Jerrabomberra areas, with limited services running between Queanbeyan and Canberra City.

Schools

Public education in Canberra, Queanbeyan and Jerrabomberra is zoned.
